May I welcome you all to the first production of our new season of plays at our "Little Theatre".

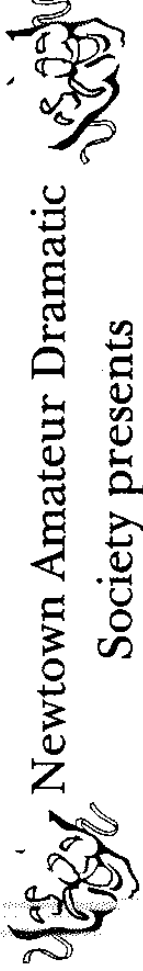

It just remains for me to thank you for your continued support and hope you will enjoy this evening and the rest of our season.

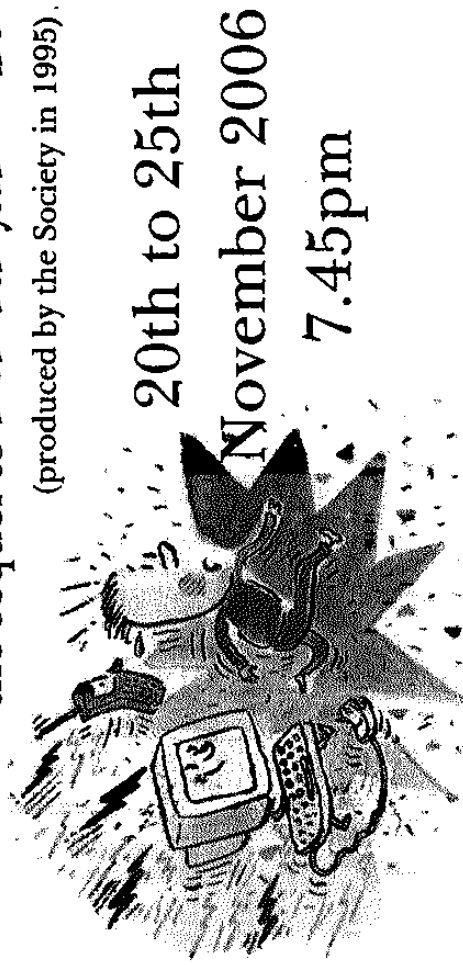

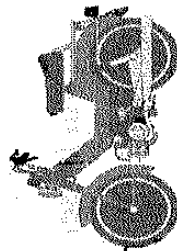
