The Society will be holding an Open Day on Saturday 23rd June, here at Powys Theatre. You are all very welcome to come and have a chat and look behind the scenes of this theatre. Discover how we use lighting and sound, how stage sets are put together, see our range of costumes and every other aspect of Powys Theatre. Further details will be advertised nearer the time.

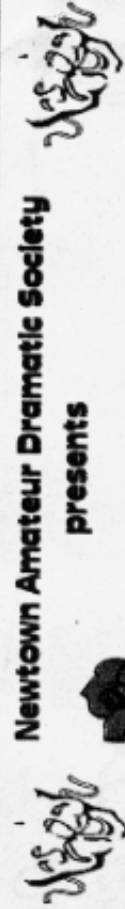
